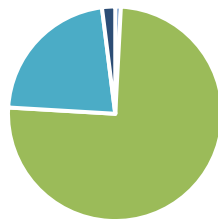

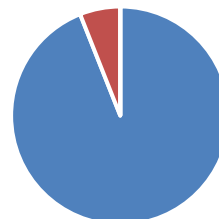

# Annual Statement & Financial Overview

---

FY2022 marked an era of new beginnings for the Arkansas Wildlife Federation (AWF). Founded in 1936, the now 87-year-old wildlife conservation organization hired an executive director in July 2022 to lead a comprehensive relaunch, bringing AWF into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

AWF's top priority is to increase its statewide reach and capacity to best meet the challenges facing wildlife today, including habitat loss, changing climate conditions, and invasive species. With a robust history to build upon, AWF is poised to continue its legacy fighting for the conservation and protection of wildlife and their habitats in Arkansas.

As the independent state affiliate of the National Wildlife Federation (NWF), substantial support towards the relaunch of AWF comes from NWF. Other partners, including the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and the Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission continue to be important supporting allies.

AWF increased its work with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), serving as a fiscal agent in support of the Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program. This program funds critical on-the-ground projects in Arkansas that have a direct benefit to wildlife, enhancing habitat on private and public lands and protecting our state's most vulnerable species.

Individual donations/memberships as well as corporate sponsorships provide critical support toward these efforts and are expected to grow in 2023 as AWF pursues fundraising campaigns in support of its ongoing work for wildlife.
